## A Message from the Board Co-Chairs and Executive Director

In 2010, over 1,600 individuals participated in Parenting Place programs, through an amazing 30,000 discrete points of contact. If you have not been to one of our locations lately, you are missing daily play and facilitated groups where parents of all backgrounds meet people, get support, learn, share, and have fun!

Parenting Place offers a lot more. We continually increase our number of Colorado Bright Beginnings visits, offer numerous expert presentations on parenting topics, serve more and more people through our donation closet and food pantry, enroll families in Medicaid and CHP+, and provide for utility assistance from Energy Outreach Colorado. Given the increased need in our community, we continue to expand our support programs and increase our capacity to work with families.

Recent strategic initiatives include certification of our family advocates in the Family Development Credential, the launch of The Incredible Years parenting class series, and the roll out of Cooking Matters nutrition courses. We also help parents use the Ages and Stages developmental survey to better understand child development.

We look forward to the expansion of our evidence based programs with proven outcomes in the Broomfield, East County and Longmont areas. What's more, using the Protective Factors Survey, we can show that participants in our facilitated groups improve in the five parenting domains that, when present, are tied directly to a lower incidence of child abuse and neglect.

We're all about families, early childhood and prevention. Our impactful work would not be possible without the professionalism and dedication of our staff, volunteers, donors, and Board of Trustees. This is an exciting time at Parenting Place!



Parenting Place is a Family Resource Center whose mission is to relieve isolation, reduce the stress of parenting, and prevent child abuse and neglect by providing outreach and a place where families can receive support, education, and develop a sense of community.

## How We Serve

Parenting Place is a nonprofit organization strengthening families in Boulder and Broomfield Counties. We are a proud member of the Family Resource Center Association. Our family advocates work with families who have children aged birth to five to help them become more self-reliant in the areas that affect family stability, including parenting, health, education, counseling and fulfillment of basic needs.

### MAKE CONNECTIONS

Parenting can be stressful and isolating. We help by creating:

- Aged-based support and playgroups (infant and toddler)
- Language-based groups (Spanish, German, French, Japanese, Mandarin, Russian)
- Family-based groups for dads, postpartum support, single moms, working moms, and adoptive parents

### GET SUPPORT

In addition to the emotional support that groups provide, Parenting Place helps families relieve some of the stress of parenting and provides basic needs to keep them healthy.

- Assistance accessing healthcare and health insurance
- Donation Closet with clothing, toys, and baby items
- Emergency funds for utility bills
- Family advocacy
- Food Pantry
- Individual counseling sessions and one-on-one support
- Latino Family Support, including ESL classes
- Referrals to community resources and services

### LEARN AND SHARE

The community we create provides a safe place for families to discuss parenting challenges. Parenting Place offers parenting and early childhood educational classes, seminars, and information.

- Colorado Bright Beginnings
- Developmental screening tools from Ages and Stages
- Lending library of parenting and children's books
- Parenting Classes, including Incredible Years BASIC, infant and toddler
- Seminars and workshops on parenting, early childhood, and stress management



## Who We Serve

### FACTS

- There are an estimated 22,769 children below age six in Boulder County in 2010.
- An estimated one in four children under age five in Boulder County was below poverty in 2009.
- 523 children were substantiated victims of maltreatment in Boulder County in 2009.
- Parents play the most important role in providing the nurturing and stimulation that children require, but they need information and support to develop good parenting skills.
- Family Resource Centers like Parenting Place provide comprehensive, coordinated supports for families in their own communities, building on a family's current resources and strengths.

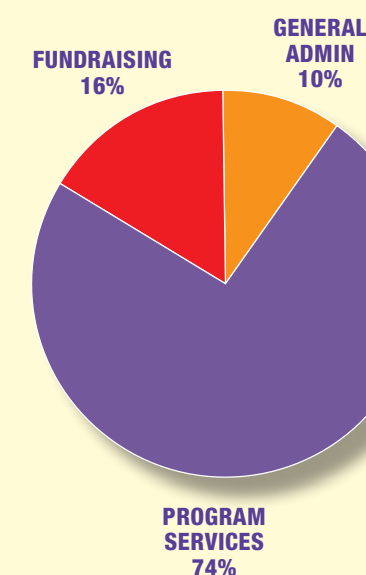
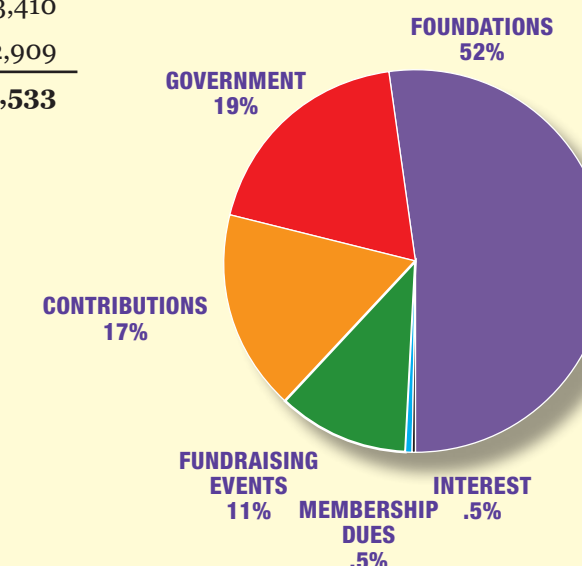
### IMPACT
